

#### Don's Monthly Message



I'm reaching out to everyone in support of our coworker Tammy Stocks.

As most are already aware, last fall she received devastating news about her son, news that no parent wishes to hear. News that would break any parent's heart, is that her son has cancer. This word unfortunately is the last word that any parent wants to hear, cause you don't know what type of cancer it is, all you know is that it is a long road ahead.

Upon receiving this news Tammy did what any parent would do, she immediately took a leave of absence from her position as a facility operator at Barnfield Point to be by her son's side during the entire process. Tammy would drive down to Sick Kids hospital multiple times while her son underwent 8, 5-day sessions of chemotherapy, staying down in Toronto anywhere she could to make the days less stressful for her son. The chemotherapy appears to have helped enough that the doctors decided it would be best for them to undertake a 16+ hour surgery, where they would take his own bone from his leg and reconstruct his arm to remove all the bone cancer that was present. During her son's time in chemotherapy he celebrated his 16th birthday, not the average way a kid would, most would be at the MTO trying to obtain their G1.

During this time Tammy has to be strong for her son, showing him that everything will be okay, even though deep down she doesn't know herself. She has to be the rock, the hope, and the uplifting spirit for her son, so he feels as if everything will be fine.

With the surgery now completed, the recovery road begins. This is a long road of multiple radiation appointments and following up with doctors to make sure everything is healing well.

As you could imagine, all of these trips to Sick Kids Hospital for chemotherapy, hotel bills for having to stay in Toronto and the medical bills not covered have put significant pressure on Tammy's financial situation. With months of treatment still to go, the pressure will only get worse. As a result, I'm reaching out to everyone to ask for your support for Tammy in any way possible, we have set up a gofund me account if you are willing to donate.

I know Tammy is strong and she wouldn't ask anyone for help, so if you are willing, would you please help me, help her get through a very difficult time. I know she will be greatly appreciative of the assistance.

We are aiming to make the donation to Tammy at the beginning of April,


With this win, they earned a berth in the GBSSA event which had 4 teams entered, Huntsville High School, St. Peter's Catholic Secondary
